February is American Heart Month

Heart disease is the leading cause of death for women in the United States and can affect women at any age. High blood pressure, high blood cholesterol, and smoking are key risk factors for heart disease.

The term, heart disease, refers to several types of heart conditions, most commonly, coronary artery disease (CAD), which affects the blood flow to the heart. Decreased blood flow can cause a heart attack.

Symptoms may include:

- **Heart attack:** Chest pain or discomfort, upper back or neck pain, indigestion, heartburn, nausea or vomiting, extreme fatigue, upper body discomfort, dizziness, and shortness of breath.
- **Arrhythmia:** Fluttering feelings in the chest (palpitations).
- **Heart failure:** Shortness of breath, fatigue, or swelling of the feet, ankles, legs, abdomen, or neck veins.

Heart disease can often be prevented if people make healthy choices and manage their health conditions. However, heart disease may be "silent" and not diagnosed until a person experiences signs or symptoms of a heart attack, heart failure, or an arrhythmia.

Several medical conditions and lifestyle choices can put people at a higher risk, include:

- Diabetes: If you have diabetes, work with your provider to manage it.
- Overweight and obesity: This puts a lot of strain on your heart. If you want help losing weight, call us.
- Unhealthy diet: Fill your plate with more produce and lean meats. And we have a free produce giveaway every 3th Wednesday.
- Physical inactivity: 150 minutes a week is recommended.
- Excessive alcohol use: Limit consumption to one drink a day if you are female and 2 per day if you are male.
